The problem solving aptitude thus serves as a value addition to the career of editing and proof reading. It is also expected from the editor that he manages marketing and business activities.

The career of editing and proofreading is open for all graduates. However, a degree in media studies or publishing studies increases the credibility of the candidate in the profession. The knowledge of English should be supplemented with the sound knowledge of technology. This is the profession one should join voluntarily as only then he can succeed. It is quite difficult in the present scenario to get a job just with a plain degree. The choice of working from home or as a freelancer is an advantage of the editing profession. It gives the employee flexibility in working time and control over working environment. It, however, needs an extra effort to get the job as a freelancer since one has to be best at communication skills, maintain contacts with publishing houses and enrich one's CV continually.

It is important to take a note of what is expected from a copy editor or proofreader. A sound knowledge of English is the most basic qualification. He has to show an evidence of working systematically. He needs to work sincerely paying attention to the minute details. Grammatical errors should not go unnoticed as it may become an unpardonable blunder in the profession. Therefore, concentration and accuracy are the key skills to be acquired by the English graduate. Acquisition of technical skills is a must in the field. An editor has to update his knowledge and technical skills as the technology keeps progressing.

The nature of the work indeed is challenging as it demands the person to work under limitations such as strict deadlines. An editor or proof reader does not have fixed schedule of working; in fact, it is a kind of contractual work which has to be completed as per the author's or publisher's timeline. There is a possibility that a tight deadline may dishearten the person but a person can cross such hurdles if he is self motivated. Another challenge in the field of editing is fierce competition. There is a limited number of employers and a huge number of aspiring candidates. One should not seek a permanent position in the profession. Being prepared for working on a freelance basis is quite beneficial. Technical publications, children's books, scientific publications may not be prestigious but can give a good start to the beginners. It should also be seen as an opportunity that the commercial organizations are thriving like anything publishing the publicity materials, newsletters etc. This is, of course, initial step. An experienced copy editor can obtain editing work in fiction and nonfiction also.

Salary for in-house and freelancers vary to a great degree. It also depends on the necessity of the authors and publishers. Experience influences the salary in the field of editing. It is also a norm to pay on the hourly basis or according to the quantity of the work. Thus, the income is purely an outcome of hard work, accuracy, concentration and language skills.
